Grace and peace to you,

As we enter the Season of Advent, and turn our attention toward Christmas, I want to thank you for your faithfulness and continued witness. Since your congregation's inception, you have observed this sacred season in concert with

Christians around the world. Together we cherish the gifts and traditions of Advent. Its message is one of light approaching, even and especially in a darkened time.

As the first season in the Christian calendar, Advent begins a new liturgical year. The Advent candles we light are amplified in the wider Festival of Lights that our friends and neighbors enjoy each year. Thank you for gathering in affirmation of Christ's birth as the primal reason for the season.

Advent provides a crescendo. It begins with the message of hope, of light shining in darkness, and culminates in a celebration of Christ's nativity. While it shares time and space with a broader holiday season, for Christians, Advent is a spiritual summons. It invites an increased attention to God's presence.

J.S Bach (1685-1750) wrote a famous piece of music that we know in a hymn entitled, "Sleepers Awake." The work of Bach is often celebrated with the sounds of grand pipe organs; however, it has gentler interpretations as well, some by piano, some

YouTube will reward your search for such offerings. My own recent search netted a gentle acoustic guitar arrangement that sounded like something a parent might use to serenade a sleeping child, in the hope that youngster would arise and see the marvel at hand.

A wise counselor said, "The Spirit rarely shouts; more often it whispers in an effort to gain our attention." To that end we are blessed with each other's company and shared witness, as those who have been affected by such whisperings. With each other's help, we echo and amplify them as we also light candles, trees and storefronts, and enjoy favorite carols and scriptures.

One of my favorite seasonal images is from someone whose name I've lost. She had been so stirred by a simple Advent candle lighting in worship, that she wrote a poem with a refrain of petition asking God, "Light tall candles in my heart." We dare ask such a thing, because of our shared belief that the light of Christ shines in the darkness, which will not overcome it.

P.W. Ministry & B&G News

PW Women's Bible Study usually meets on the third Wednesday morning of the month. Our next gathering will take place on the second <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>Pecember 13</u>, at 10:30 am in Voight Hall. This month, instead of Bible Study, we will be signing Christmas eards to send to those not able to get out and about or need encouragement. There will not be a Zoom link for this meeting. Finger foods/goodies may be brought to share.

Regular Bible Study lesson will resume on Wednesday, January 17, 2023, at 10:30 am in Voight Hall/Zoom. We will continue our lessons from Sacred Encounters: The Power and Presence of Jesus Christ in Luke-Mets authored by Olive Mahabir. In the nine lessons of this Bible study – the author invites readers to consider Jesus, "the good shepherd" (Luke 10:15), who shared the Good News through sacred encounters with everyday people. The Gospel according to Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, or Luke-Acts "one story in two parts," demonstrate the unfolding of God's redemptive purposes in human history and present a distinctive perspective on the person and work of Jesus Christ. Written by Luke, a physician and traveling companion of Paul, the message to the early Christian community (and to us) is radical, inclusive, and hope filled. Further, this message invites the church to deeper, compassionate engagement with the world. "What are the potential implications for the church if we treat our interactions as sacred encounters that demonstrate the transformative love of Christ Jesus?" BUILDINGS & GROUNDS

Once again our church has been the recipient of Al Colquhoun's construction expertise and we thank him for the work he continues to do on our behalf.

The wood on the overhang in front of Voight Hall has been in a state of disrepair for years. The header and the ends of the eaves were severely damaged with dry rot.

Al used new wood, and also repurposed some wood from the sanctuary garden project. Once the construction was completed, everything received a fresh coat of paint and the gutter was relocated.

Work is also being done on the inside of Voight Hall. The unsightly metal ceiling apparatuses that formerly held up the sliding room dividers are being removed and replaced with new ceiling tiles. The long divider in the center of the room cannot be removed as it is needed to structurally hold up the ceiling tile support frames so that will have a new metal cover. Once that structural work is completed the entire ceiling will receive a fresh coat of paint.

The Learning Zone would like to thank each one of you for your support this past year and wishes you a very Merry Christmas!


Our Christmas break is from December 18th – January 5th. We will resume back in session on Tuesday, January 9, 2024.



FINANCE UPDATE

January through October, 2023

Contributions: \$209,645 Other Income: \$40,007 Total Income: \$249,652 Expenses: \$241,641 Excess Expense: \$8,011

Transfers from Operating Reserves (savings): \$25,000

We thank the congregation for another financially positive month. October income was \$23,694 and expenses were \$17,139 resulting in excess income of \$6,5656. We were able to transfer \$5,000 into our operating reserves (savings account)! We are grateful for the gift of Pastor Steve and look forward to his positive ministry on our church and our financial security.

We hope to continue to increase the balance in our reserve/savings account and we pray for your continued support for the remainder of the year. First Presbyterian Church is a blessing!
