



Grace and peace to you,

As we move further into the Season of Lent, I hope you will find time for reflection and the practices you find to be renewing. As we pray for personal guidance and growth, let us remember to pray for the church;

may we be thankful for the ways it has blessed and enriched our lives. May our hearts and minds be open to all who need the faith we share, and the love that strengthens us in Christ Jesus.

In a collection of the late Henri Nouwen's writings on the spiritual life, there is a short piece entitled "Time Enough to Minister". It contains good advice for anyone who is unexpectedly called upon to lend an ear, or to offer a word of counsel or encouragement to someone in need.

Nouwen (1932-1996) tells the story of a time when he had gone on a personal retreat, that he describes as a short prayer sabbatical from his teaching at Yale Divinity School. He had gone to a Trappist monastery in Western New York State, as he was suffering burnout from a heavy load of teaching, travel and lecturing.

It was on his second day of refuge at the monastery, that a group of students from a nearby school had gotten word of Nouwen's arrival. They came to him and asked, "Henri, can you give us a retreat?"

In keeping with the customs of the monastery, Nouwen

went to the Abbot in charge and asked for permission to decline the students' request. After all, he had come to the monastery seeking relief from such demands. However, much to Nouwen's initial displeasure, the Abbot instructed him to do as the students asked.

The Abbot said to Nouwen, "Don't fuss about your need for preparation in readying to be with these young people; what they want is to be a part of your life in God for a few days. If you pray for half an hour in the morning, sing in our choir for an hour, and do your spiritual reading, you'll have so much to say, you could give ten retreats."

Nouwen drew a lesson from this experience of being asked to provide for others when he felt in particular need of receiving provision for himself. The lesson, he said, is to do what one must to live in a state of ongoing preparedness; so that when someone needs to be part of our life in God, we can give as it is asked of us.

Blessings to you in this Season of Lent.

Mission Ministry

Lent is a time for reflection, and for FPC it is also the time when we receive the One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) special offering. For 75 years, Presbyterians have participated in One Great Hour of Sharing, an ecumenical effort that was begun soon after the end of WWII and now involves 9 denominations as well as Church World Service (CWS).

Within the Presbyterian denomination, funds received as OGHS offerings are divvied among three major programs: Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), the Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP), and the Self-Development of People (SDOP.) This is the single largest way that Presbyterians join together to share God's love with our neighbors in need around the world.



Duncan finds especially significant being part of a community: "Meeting people and forming relationships, where we share common things—our struggle with mental health, our struggle with homelessness—we're able to have that support and support each other."

Please watch for bulletin inserts during March to learn more about beneficiaries of OGHS funds. We are the church together, and when everyone gives a little, it adds up to a lot. Please give generously so that together we can help provide relief from natural disasters, food for the hungry, and support for the poor and oppressed.




Testimony from recipients of OGHS funds reveals the impact of this offering. A Dalit widow in India whose family lost its thatched hut and the sewing machine that enabled her to provide for her family in a recent tsunami says: "Because of people's gifts to One Great Hour of Sharing, we now live in a permanent and disaster-resistant shelter, my kids are back in school, I am able to feed and clothe them, and when they get sick, I am able to take care of their medication, too." A Presbyterian Disaster Assistance aid worker for Asia and Africa noted that one of the key tenets followed by PDA is to partner with local aid agencies. This means that aid is delivered in such a way that community stakeholders are consulted and allowed to prioritize needs.

Closer to home, OGHS helps fund Caridad Gardens in Las Vegas, NV which works to restore houseless veterans and neighbors back into community. Duncan, a client of Caridad, expressed gratitude for the stable housing and employment Caridad Gardens facilitated for him as well as for helping him get the counseling and medication he needs.

Session last met on February 20, 2024.

Of interest:

- Approved updated job descriptions prepared by the Personnel Committee
- Approved FPC Personnel Policies and Procedures
- Approved the election of Pat Wallace as Clerk of Session for 2024
- Elected Priscilla Peters and Dave Posluch as the Elder Representatives for the 2024 Nominating Committee
- Approved the 2024 Mission Pledge with \$3,500 going to General Assembly Basic Mission and \$3,500 going to Synod/Presbytery Basic Mission
- Reorganized our committee structure, eliminating Technology as a standalone committee and transferring that
 responsibility to Buildings & Grounds, and combining Adult and Student Ministries into a single Christian Education
 Committee
- Appointed two special task forces, one to review the membership roll and another to develop an online FPC calendar accessible to all via the website
- Received an update on an expedited Presbytery-sanctioned method for churches seeking pastors to conduct a Mission Study.

Not atypical in January, income was also below budget, resulting in excess expense of \$22.
