

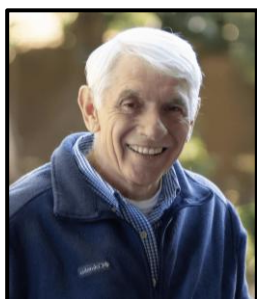
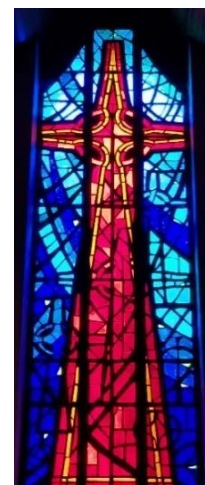

A little while back I came across an interesting quote. It is from Mahatma Gandhi. He seemed to appreciate the Bible and said this about it. “You Christians look after a document containing enough dynamite to blow all civilization to pieces, turn the world upside down and bring peace to a battle-torn planet. But you treat it as though it is nothing more than a piece of literature.”

This quote can make us wonder, why so many followers of Christ don’t see the Bible as a dynamite book. For many it is just a nice book of literature; much like Moby Dick, To Kill a Mocking Bird, the Brothers Karamazov, Go Tell it on the Mountain, Harry Potter, Little Women, The Hobbit, etc. The Bible does have great literature in it, but that is not the purpose of the Bible. Its purpose is to draw us to Jesus Christ.

For many the light has gone out of their study to the Bible. We feel it is dull. Or we can’t figure out exactly what the Scripture means. It seems out of date and old. For some it is just that the claims of the Bible are too far out: creation in 7 days, walking on water, a world-wide flood, etc. In some circles today, the Bible is even being considered harmful or dangerous.

On Sunday, January 11th, we will start a new Bible study. It will be a class based on Rev. Dan Kimball’s book, “How (Not) To Read the Bible.” The subtitle of this book says, “Making sense of the Anti-women, Anti-science, Pro-violence, Pro-slavery, and other crazy Sounding Parts of

Scripture.” It is a good book and I hope we have a good class.

Many of us just need a reboot on how we study the Bible. It is not a magical book. It is not a science book. It is not a book about history. In fact, it is not a book at all, it is a library of books. Sixty-six books in all. Come learn a little bit about this powerful book. God wrote it for us, maybe we should check it out. Why not make getting serious with the Bible your New Year’s resolution. Happy New Years and thanks for letting me be your interim pastor.

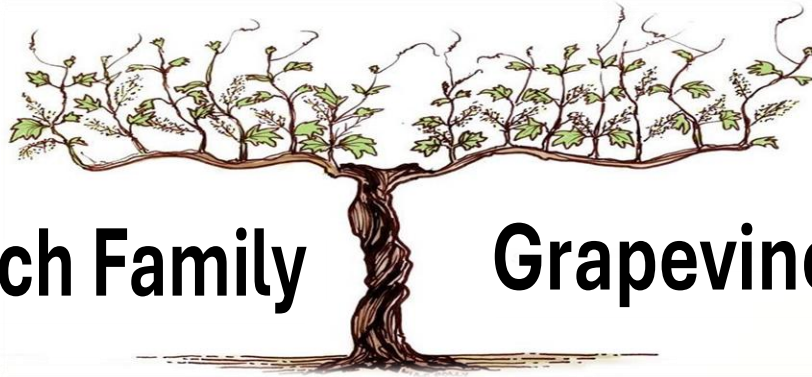

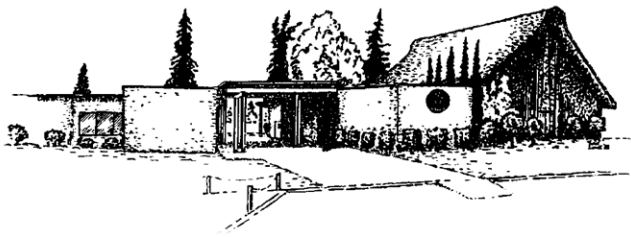
