A Message From Our Pastor's Heart Rev. Dr. Craig J. Wright

Greetings Church Family,

Marcy and I are heading south and have a portside window in our cabin. I am watching the sunrise through the morning clouds and the rays of light as they beam through the distant marine layer. The display is majestic and makes me think about heaven. My mind has traveled back so many times to March of 2020 when we were the lucky recipients of extra cruise days compliments of Covid-19 and Princess Cruise lines. On our way back from Hawaii the world broke out with the novel virus and we had our fifteen minutes of fame locked on a cruise ship. A "first world" problem. The big difference this time is the glorious sunrise I am watching from my stateroom BALCONY!! On our last cruise, to save some money we opted for an inside cabin, with no windows, no natural light, and no fresh ocean breeze. We hoped to spend time on the upper deck soaking all that in. Hindsight. That will not happen again. That was then, back to the present.

I knew I would be writing this article aboard ship and so certain images have been rising and falling in my mind since we embarked a few days ago. I keep coming back to the obvious thing, I can see the sunrise, I can see and hear the ocean from the balcony, and it is so much better than being trapped in a floating walk-in closet. It is much better for my soul and sanity. The beauty, the vastness of the North Atlantic, and the promise of intriguing ports of call bring something like a cleansing bliss. (and without the drinks package) For the last four weeks, my sermons have been centered around the theme of love. God's love for us and our love for one another. Stephanie brought a sermon on the vastness of God's love as well.

Living in the awareness of God's love and practicing that love for others will move your soul from the darkness of an inside stateroom to the beauty of an ocean view with a balcony. The difference is life changing. In her sermon, Stephanie mentioned the Levitical blessing - "May the Lord bless you and keep you and cause His face to shine upon youand turn his face toward you and give you peace." She mentioned this idea of God turning his face toward you, meaning God is giving you His total attention. What a great thought. Now here is the twist- the irony. Ready? The light of the sun will only reach you when you have a window or can get outside, but the light of God's face, the love radiating from the gaze of Christ can reach you anywhere you are at any time and bring joy to your soul. The Apostle Paul who spent much time on a ship in the Mediterranean lost in a storm, will tell you the sunshine on your face is nice, but the shine of God's face on your soul is the only thing that will bring you joy, especially in the rough seas of life. He wrote -"For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor principalities, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom 8:38,39) Said another way, nothing can separate you from the light of God's love, nothing will ever break God's loving gaze toward you.

May the Son rise in your heart and bring you peace! See you soon.







FPC LEARNING ZONE



PRESBTERIAN WOMEN MINISTRY

PW Women's Bible Study meets on the third Wednesday morning of the month. Our next gathering will take place on Wednesday, November 16, 2022, at 10:30 am in Voight Hall. There will be a Zoom link available for those that need that option. This month's lesson is titled, "Sabbath and Sunday." The scripture passages are Luke 4:16-22 and Acts 16:11-15. Over the centuries, Christians begin to celebrate the Sabbath on Sunday, but we still haven't come to an agreement on quite what that means. This uncertainty may be an opportunity.



Our study comes from the 2022-23 PW/Horizons Bible Study: Celebrating Sabbath: Accepting God's Gift of Rest and Delight authored by Carol M. Bechtel. In the nine lessons of this Bible study – with passages from Genesis, Exodus, Deuteronomy, Isiah, Matthew, Luke, and Acts – we'll consider Sabbath: as a celebration, not a day of dreary formality; as God's intent for all of creation that includes busy women too; as one day of the week, perhaps a Sunday; as a time to surrender unhealthy striving and frantic busyness, and instead trust that God will provide; as a reminder that life is precious and working too much is against God's plans for our precious lives; as a day devoted to community and justice and not exclusively to self-care. Ultimately, Sabbath reminds us to honor God who honors us by giving us a day each week to reset our pace, our priorities, and our lives.


