

Holiday Greetings,

Some of you have heard this before. That does not make it redundant: it just makes you lucky for hearing again. This is timely for the Advent season. Last Wednesday many of us gathered for the annual service hosted by our deacons. The service is called, "Tidings of Comfort." It is always a wonderful time to reflect and remember. Tears and smiles and hugs and candles always make a meaningful combination.

For the bulletin, Polet asked me if it was "Tidings of Comfort and Joy" or "Tidings of Comfort and Hope." I said it was just "Tidings of comfort" but I missed the point by leaving off the word 'joy' or 'hope.' 'Tidings of Comfort' is taken from the song God Rest Ye Merry Gentleman. This medieval Christmas carol has been unintentionally turned upside down by the change in word meanings from the 1500s to today. Did you know, the words "rest" and "merry" had a much different spin 500 years ago? "Rest" was used to mean "make" or "cause" while "merry" meant "strength" or "power". The Christmas medieval hymn correctly interpreted translates, "God make (not rest) you strong (not merry) gentlemen, let nothing you dismay" and not "God give you rest, you folks who are having too much fun, you merry-makers and revelers." The unknown peasant author of this hymn was inspired by the words of the angels to the shepherds on Christmas Eve...

Luke 2: "And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, 'Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger."" (btw, I always read this and hear the voice of Linus reciting it from Shultz's Peanuts Christmas – I loved that show!)

Good Tidings of Great Joy... or, as the song says, "Oh tidings of comfort and joy, comfort and joy, oh tidings of comfort and joy." Another document from the 16th century jumps to mind when I read about comfort and joy, the Heidelberg Catechism. In its opening sentence, the catechism asks the question, "What is your only *comfort*, in life and in death?" The short and most profound answer is this: "That I belong, body and soul, in life and in death, not to myself, but to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ."

We all know that the holidays can be stressful times. We all know that any annual celebration often marks the loss of loved ones. But we are not without comfort, and we are not without joy. The angels said to the shepherds, "For unto YOU...is born a savior." Christ has come for you! Christ is your savior! Yes, Christ came to save the world, but Christ also came for you. It's personal: you are God's dear child. I can almost hear the shepherd sheepishly respond to the angelic declaration: "Um... are you talking to me?" And the angel in reply says, "YES...unto YOU means You, unto You is born a savior." Be strong, be of good courage, because God has become flesh to save you, to bring peace to you and peace on this earth. To give you strength in times of weakness, joy in times of sorrow. This Advent season may the Joy of Christ give you strength, joy, and hope.
