Karl Barth was one of the most recognized theologians in the 20th century. He was an outstanding scholar. While I was a student in Seminary, I decided to fulfill an Historical Theology class assignment by writing a paper on one of Barth's

books. The book was about his beliefs on the Scripture. I was looking forward to reading it and writing a paper on it. Unfortunately, I couldn't understand what he was saying. The book was over my head. I didn't know what to write. Furthermore, my professor, Dr. Bromiley, had translated the book into English and was an expert of Barth. So, I sheepishly decided to write about one of B.B. Warfield's (a scholar at Princeton) books.

The only book Barth wrote that I could understand was one he wrote on Baptism. I later found out that it was not a scholarly book, but rather, a series of sermons he once gave to a church Barth's intellect was huge and he completely humbled me.

So, it was with great interest that I read the following quote from Barth understand. During his 1962 lecture tour of the USA, a student asked Barth to summarize his entire theological work in one sentence. After a moment of thought, Barth responded, "Yes, I can. In the words of a song I learned at my mother's knee: 'Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so.'"

At last, here is something that Karl Barth wrote that I can understand, or at least attempt to understand. "Jesus love me" is a profound theological truth. A truth that both scholars and children can grasp. And we know that it is true because the Bible tells us. The veracity of the bible is another great theological truth. This book not only

contains the word of God, but it is the word of God. And it tells us Jesus loves us.

The origins of the song "Jesus loves me," is interesting. The hymn was first written as a poem to comfort a dying child in the novel "Say and Seal." The love of Jesus comforts the believer, announcing a love that transcends even death. As the apostle Paul wrote, "I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Karl Barth got it right and he put it in words we can all understand. Jesus loves you. Furthermore, there is nothing that you can do to make Him love you more than he already does, and there is nothing you can do to make Him love you less. All we have to do is live in His love! Now that almost makes me burst forth in song! Jesus loves me this I know, for the Bible tells me so.






