Grace and peace to you,

As we enter the New Year, I want to offer you God's blessing, and my best wishes for your life in 2024!

I also want to call your attention to January 6th, the Day of Epiphany. While Christmas celebrates the birth of Jesus, the

One we call the Christ, Epiphany celebrates the manifestation of his glory, the glory of God shining in the face of Jesus Christ. As the prologue in the Gospel of John says, "We have seen his glory, the glory of the only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth." (John 1:14, NIV)

The day of Epiphany is celebrated as the manifestation of Christ, particularly to the Gentiles, as represented by the Magi. (Matthew 2:1-12) The phenomenon of Christian Epiphany (or recognizing the glory of God in Jesus) has echoes in the Old Testament, too, especially in the Psalms.

"Ascribe to the Lord, the glory due his name; worship the Lord in the splendor of his holiness." (Psalm 29:2, NIV)

The Greek root of the English word "doxology" is associated with praise. What is familiarly known among many Christians as "The Doxology" tells us to praise God "above the heavenly host". People who are steeped in the language of the New Testament say that the praise called for in the Doxology, means literally "to speak glory."

In a line central to the words of Handel's "Messiah", the prophet Isaiah is quoted.

In the first of the Servant Songs, Isaiah foretells of the coming Messiah as one whose reign will lift every valley and make the mountains low. (Isaiah 40:4)

That prophecy offers a clue to the significance of Epiphany, when the Wisemen (sometimes known as the Magi or Kings) followed a star to Bethlehem. Long before that day when God's glory was manifest in the birth of Jesus Christ, Isaiah had prophesied that the Messiah would be persuasive and powerful enough to elevate the downtrodden while humbling even those of the highest status.

Perhaps the best part of the good news Epiphany offers, is that something is asked of us. The glory and phenomena of Epiphany seek our cooperation. God desires our willingness to be those people who are lifted when we are low, and humbled when we are haughty, to the end that we may live together in God's goodness and glory.



PW Women's Bible Study meets on the third Wednesday morning of the month. Our next gathering will take place on Wednesday, January 17, at 10:30 am in Voight Hall. There will be a Zoom link available for those that need that option. This month's lesson is titled, "Mary and Martha Encounter Jesus." The scripture passage is Luke 10: 38-42. The main idea: Jesus calls us to value the role of each person in the community of faith.

Introducing the 2023-24 PW/Horizons Bible Study: <u>Sacred Encounters: The Power and Presence of Jesus Christ in</u> <u>Luke-Acts</u> authored by Olive Mahabir. In the nine lessons of this Bible study – the author invites readers to consider Jesus, "the good shepherd" (Luke 10:15), who shared the Good News through sacred encounters with everyday people. The Gospel according to Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, or Luke-Acts "one story in two parts," demonstrate the unfolding of God's redemptive purposes in human history and present a distinctive perspective on the person and work of Jesus Christ. Written by Luke, a physician and traveling companion of Paul, the message to the early Christian community (and to us) is radical, inclusive, and hope filled. Further, this message invites the church to deeper, compassionate engagement with the world. "What are the potential implications for the church if we treat our interactions as sacred encounters that demonstrate the transformative love of Christ Jesus?"
